- Yow, the Hebrew word for "day" in Genesis 1, means a regular 24-hour day.

## OutWord For Family Discussion

You may hear people say that the universe is millions of years old, that the book of Genesis is not literal, and that the days of creation were actually long periods of time. What can you say to them?

It's always best to let the Bible speak for itself. The book of Genesis clearly describes each day as having an evening and a morning. I believe the days of creation were 24 -hour days. You see, whenever the word "day" appears in the Bible with the phrase "evening and morning" and
 has a number like first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth-like it does in Genesis 1, it means a 24-hour day.
