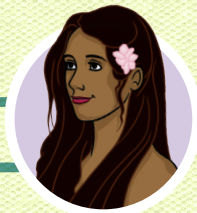
God Creates Marriage

OutWord *For Family Discussion*

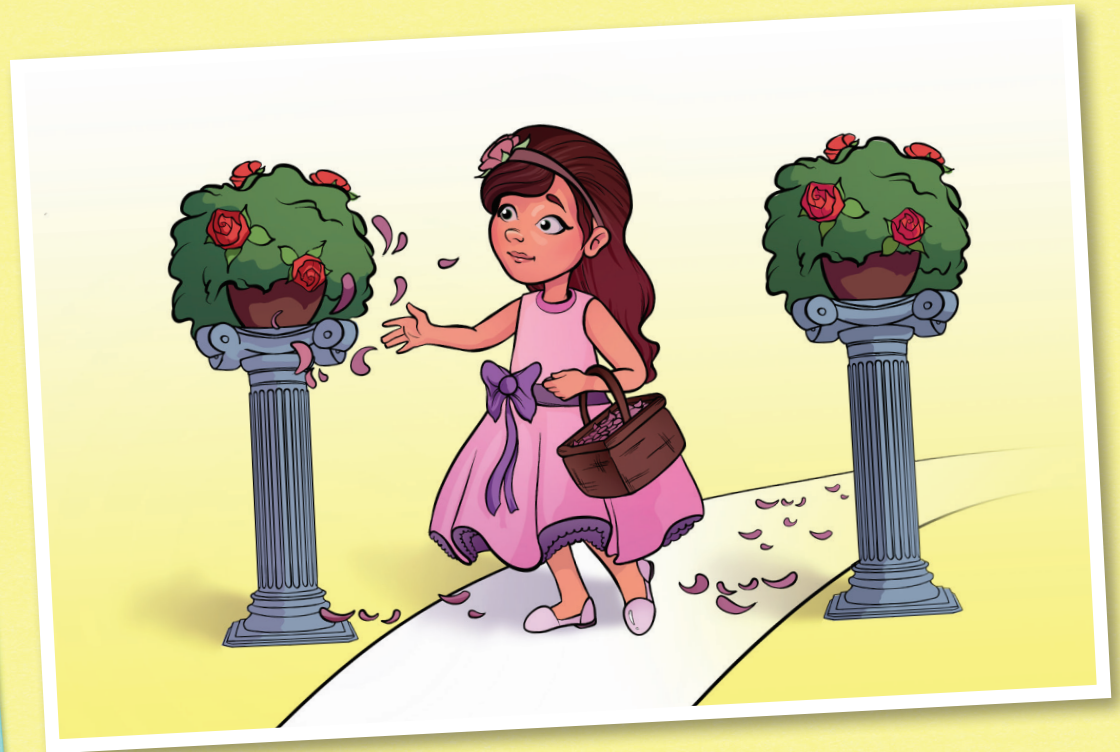
One of your friends asks you, “What do you think about marriage? Why is it so important anyway? It seems silly that you should stay with the same person all your life.” **What would you say?**
