



Q OutWord For Family Discussion

Your friend says she just wants to follow her heart and do what she wants to do. What could you say?

You may want to think about that. After all, the Bible says that our hearts are deceitful and sinful. When we follow our hearts, we usually do whatever we want to do and that often gets us into trouble! God's Word is a better place to turn—it can help direct you to decisions that will honor God

In HomeWord For Parents

The Bible clearly states that death spread to all men through the sin of Adam (Romans 5:12). We have all inherited a sin nature. David knew that he was conceived in sin—an inheritance from Adam (Psalm 51:5). And Jeremiah reminds us that the heart is deceitful above all things and desperately sick (Jeremiah 17:9). Our sin demands judgment by a holy God. Jesus tells us that judgment is coming. He is coming to judge the world in righteousness and faithfulness (Psalm 96:13).

So what are we to do? We know that our holy, jealous God is a consuming fire who will not tolerate our loyalty, love, honor, and respect being placed anywhere else (Deuteronomy 4:23-24). He is intolerant of sin, and we are all sinners (Romans 3:23).

"But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:57)! For God had always known that He would send His Son

> that whoever believes in Him would not perish but have eternal life (John

> > 3:16). Through Christ alone are we brought from darkness into light and from the power of Satan to God. Through Jesus our Savior we receive forgiveness of our sins and a place in eternity with Him (Acts 26:18).
