Help each of us, O Lord, to experience the same joy which the friends of Jesus felt when meeting the risen Christ.



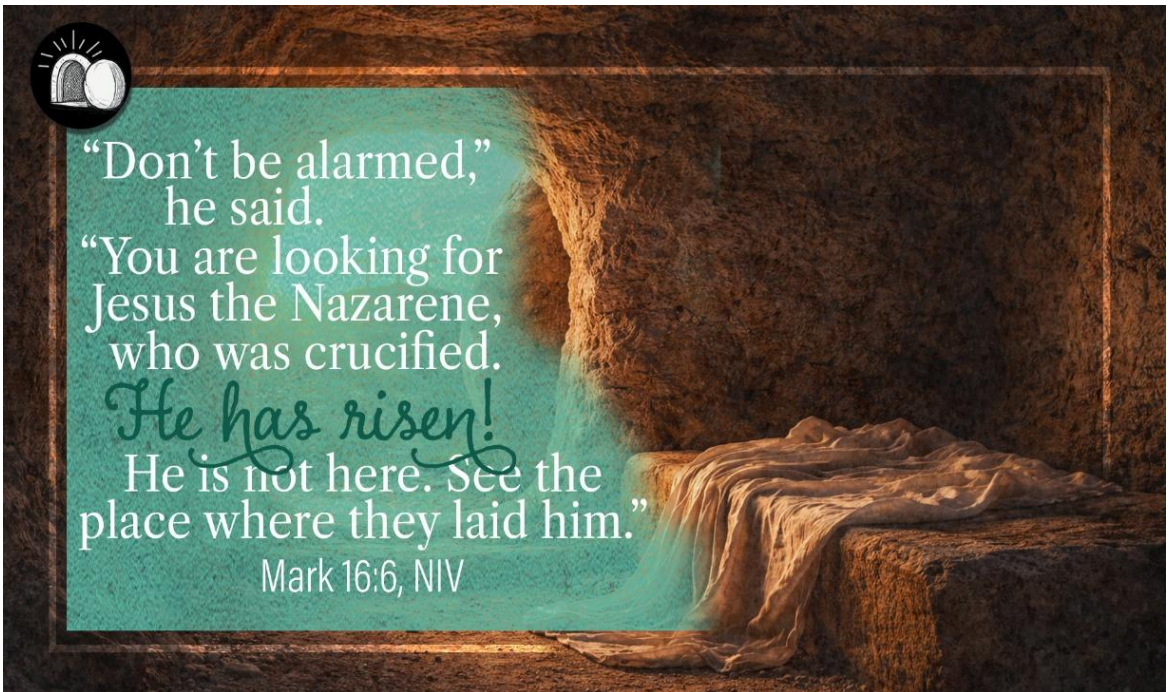
